* WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE START OF THE PLAY *

Twelve years before the play begins, the Duke Prospero and his daughter, Miranda, are tricked and banished by his villainous brother, Antonio. They are put aboard a tiny boat (with magical books from Prospero's library) by Gonzala and set to sea, where, eventually, they land upon Bermuda, which is inhabited by Ariel (a magical spirit) and Caliban (an islander). Prospero takes control of the island and treats both Caliban and Ariel as indentured servants.

The play begins with Prospero ordering Ariel to conjure a tempest, in which Antonio—along with Gonzala, Queen Alonsa, her son Ferdinand, and others—are shipwrecked upon the island. Both Caliban and Ariel seek freedom from Prospero throughout the play.

* SHAKESPEARE & BERMUDA *

Shakespeare wrote *The Tempest* in 1611, after reading a letter describing the wreck of the *Sea Venture* off the coast of Bermuda in 1609. It is the last play written entirely by Shakespeare. Our company has added songs with contemporary lyrics that expand on Shakespeare's characters and challenge the colonial prejudices of the original text.
